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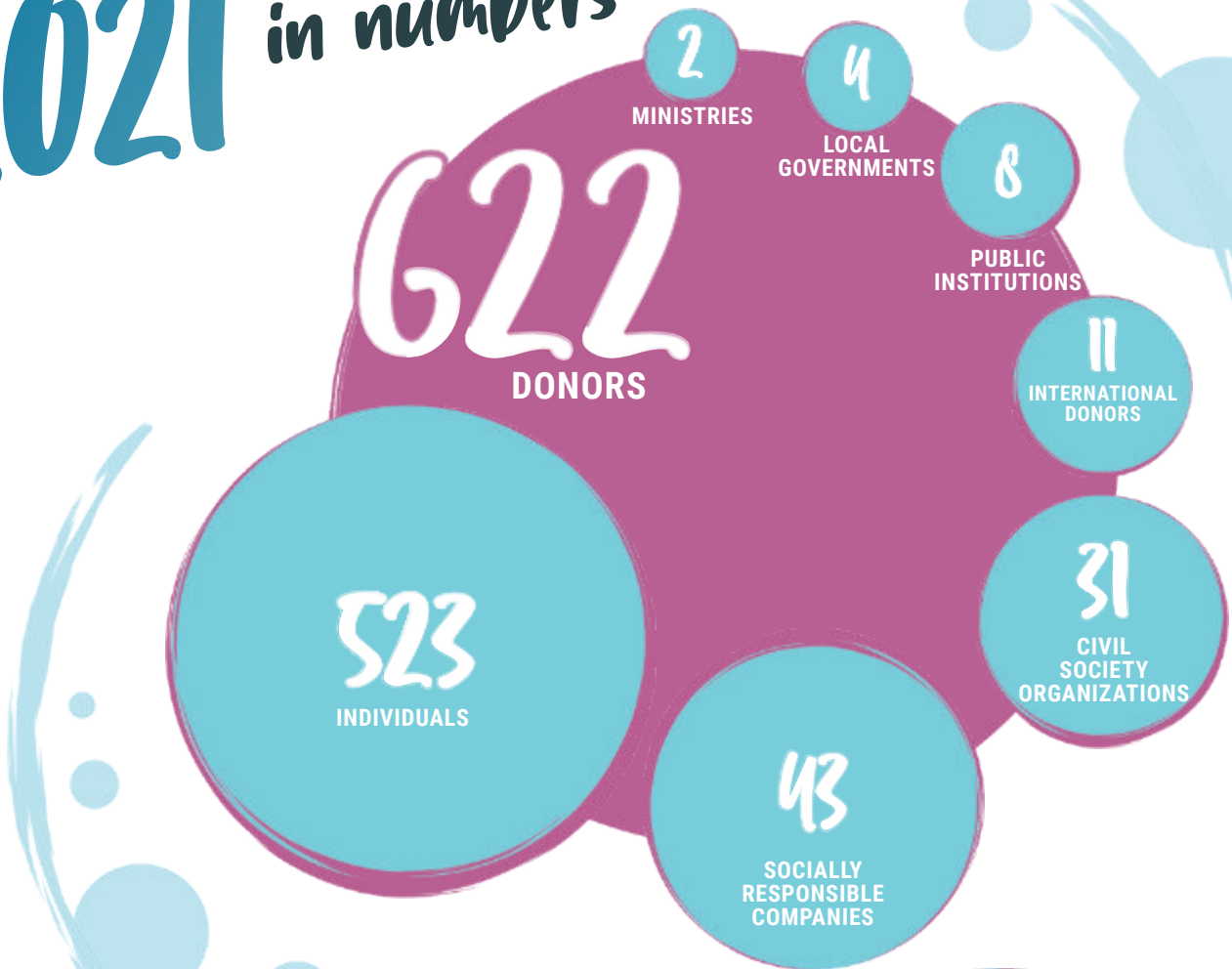

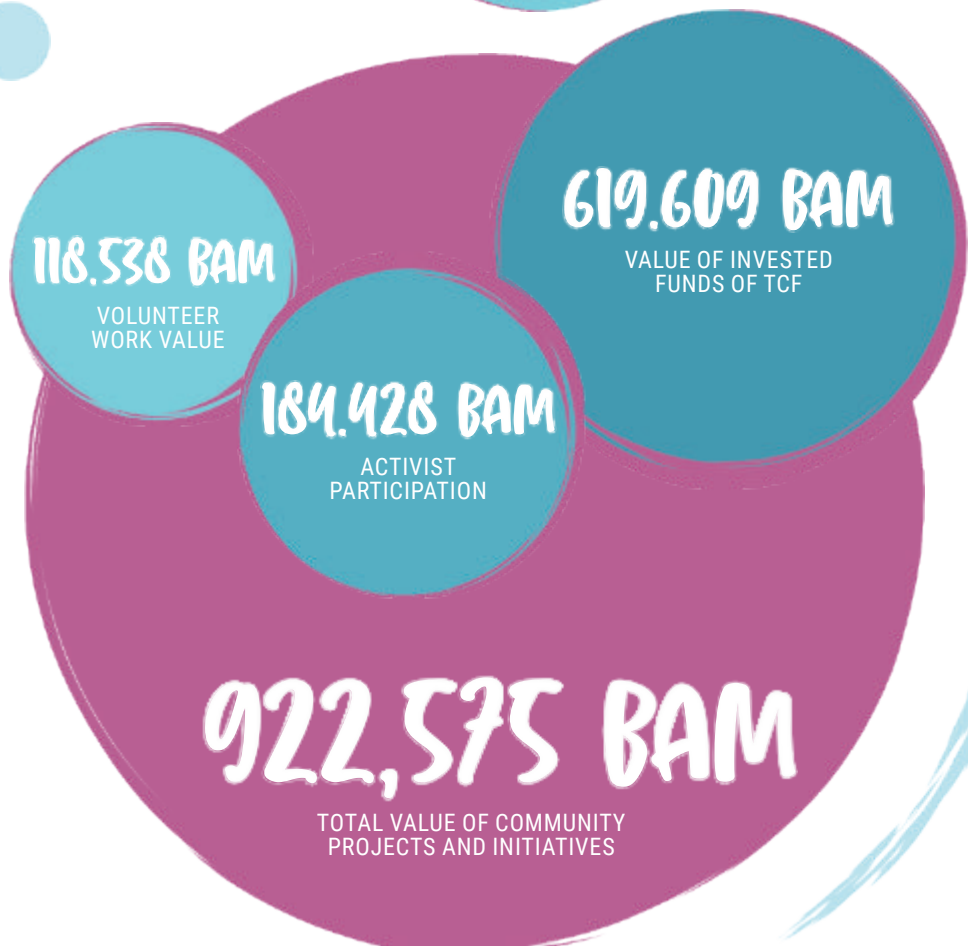
DONATOR STRUCTURE

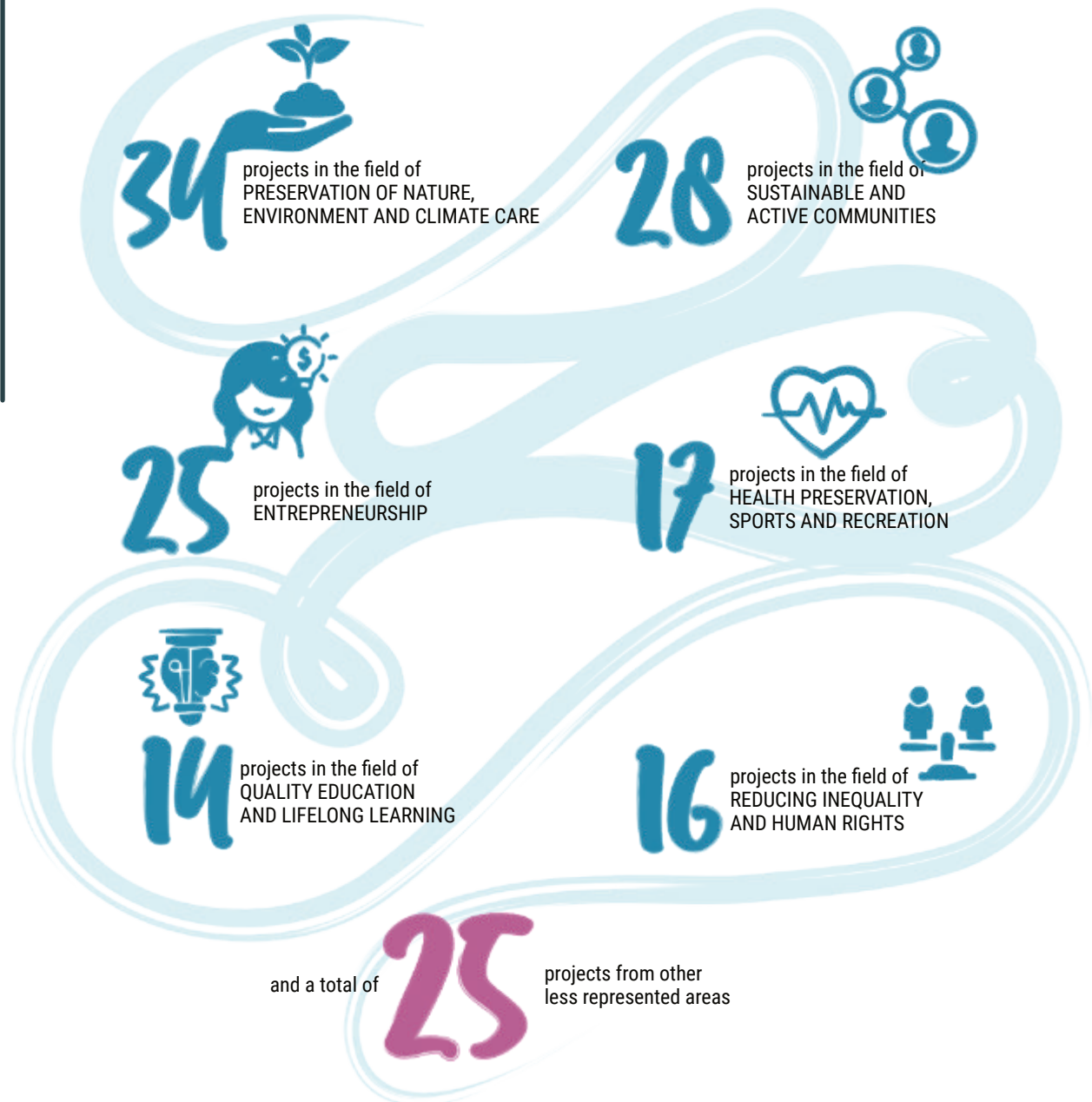

Through this campaign, significant funds were collected from the business sector, as well as individuals, for the renovation of part of the premises in the Home for Children without Parental Care in Tuzla. This was a campaign that best demonstrated the strength of a united and solidary community!

Among other activities, we invite you to read about the cooperation we achieved with experienced psychologists and psychotherapists from professional associations from Tuzla, with the aim of providing psychological support to our colleagues in the civil sector. We are happy that despite all the challenges, we remained healthy, united and in solidarity not only with each other in the Foundation team, but also with all our colleagues in the civil sector.

II SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Youth Program

Although the situation with the COVID-19 pandemic continued to make work with young people in the community challenging, activities within the Youth Bank project continued and more than a hundred young people participated in educational activities and the decision-making process on supporting youth projects in a transparent and responsible manner.

Youth Bank

The Youth Bank program was implemented in 5 municipalities and cities of the Tuzla Canton (Tuzla, Lukavac, Živinice, Kalesija and Srebrenik), and 119 young people successfully completed it. During the one-year

mandate, young people had the opportunity to learn about the community they live in, the needs and problems of young people, democratic decision-making and other content aimed at the all-round development of young people and their stronger social engagement.

The committees of the Youth Banks were led by young coordinators/volunteers who motivated the youth in the committees to actively get involved in the program and social life of the community, leading numerous educational workshops and other activities during the year. Through this process, they became successful young leaders themselves.

Trainings, workshops and support decision-making

The training "How to decide in the Youth Bank" was attended by 127 young people who learned about the rules and procedures of work in the YB, assessment and evaluation of youth initiatives, and methods of objective and democratic decision-making. During this training, young people also learned about the concepts of philanthropy and volunteerism, as the basic values of the civil sector. During the one-year mandate, members of the YB board considered a total of 48 project proposals and made a decision to support 25 projects.

Summer camp with YB members.

In 2021, the conditions for the continuation of the summer camp for members of the OB were finally created, and the camp was held in compliance with all hygienic and epidemiological measures. During this year's camp, emphasis was placed on the topics of philanthropy and ecology, so through various educational activities young people learned how to act in everyday life and what activities to take or not to take in order to reduce the negative impact on nature and the environment. At this summer camp, 75 young people learned about how "community" foundations around the world develop local philanthropy.

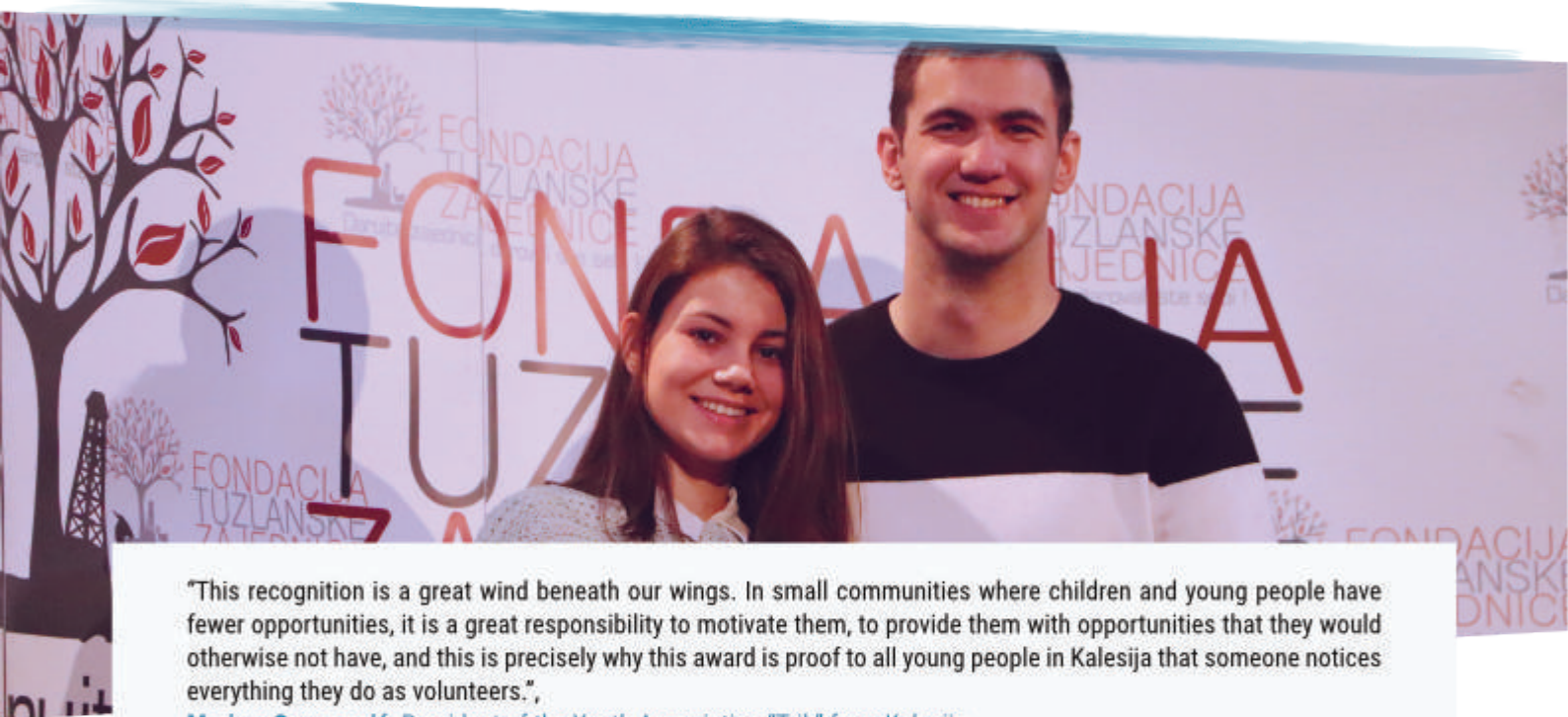

Youth Bank Conference „Youth Inspiration Academy“

In anticipation of the International Day of Volunteers from 12.01. until 05.12., the "Youth Inspiration Academy" educational conference was organized for young people. At the conference, we celebrated the successes of young people and enabled them to participate in interactive educational workshops in areas that are focused on their personal development and progress. Young people had the opportunity to participate in workshops related to civic activism, entrepreneurship and preserving mental health.

The conference ended with the ceremonial awarding of the "Hero of your community" award in 2021. This award is traditionally given to individuals, associations and companies who, through their volunteer engagement in the past period, have made an exceptional contribution to the development of young people. This year's award winners, according to the following categories, were:

- **Youth Association "Trik" Kalesija**, for exceptional contribution to the development and empowerment of young people in the Municipality of Kalesija;
- **Asja Dizdarević**, for exceptional contribution to the development of young people and the youth sector;
- **Merima Dževdetbegović**, for exceptional contribution to the development of children and youth in the social protection system;
- **Citizens' Association "Kaskader produkcija"**, for the best implemented project in 2021;
- **Amila Spahić**, for exceptional volunteer engagement in the work of the Youth Bank in 2021.

This year as well, we wanted to draw attention to young people and the problems they face, and also send a message to everyone that it is necessary to invest more in young people and work with them in order to create an affirmative environment in which young people want to stay. The central activity was organized in the popular youth cafe "Sloboda" in Tuzla, where young people were given the opportunity to exchange ideas with each other, socialize, discuss problems in the community and send a "message in a bottle" to the authorities - i.e., to write questions that will be forwarded to competent institutions that should take care of the position and opportunities for young people.

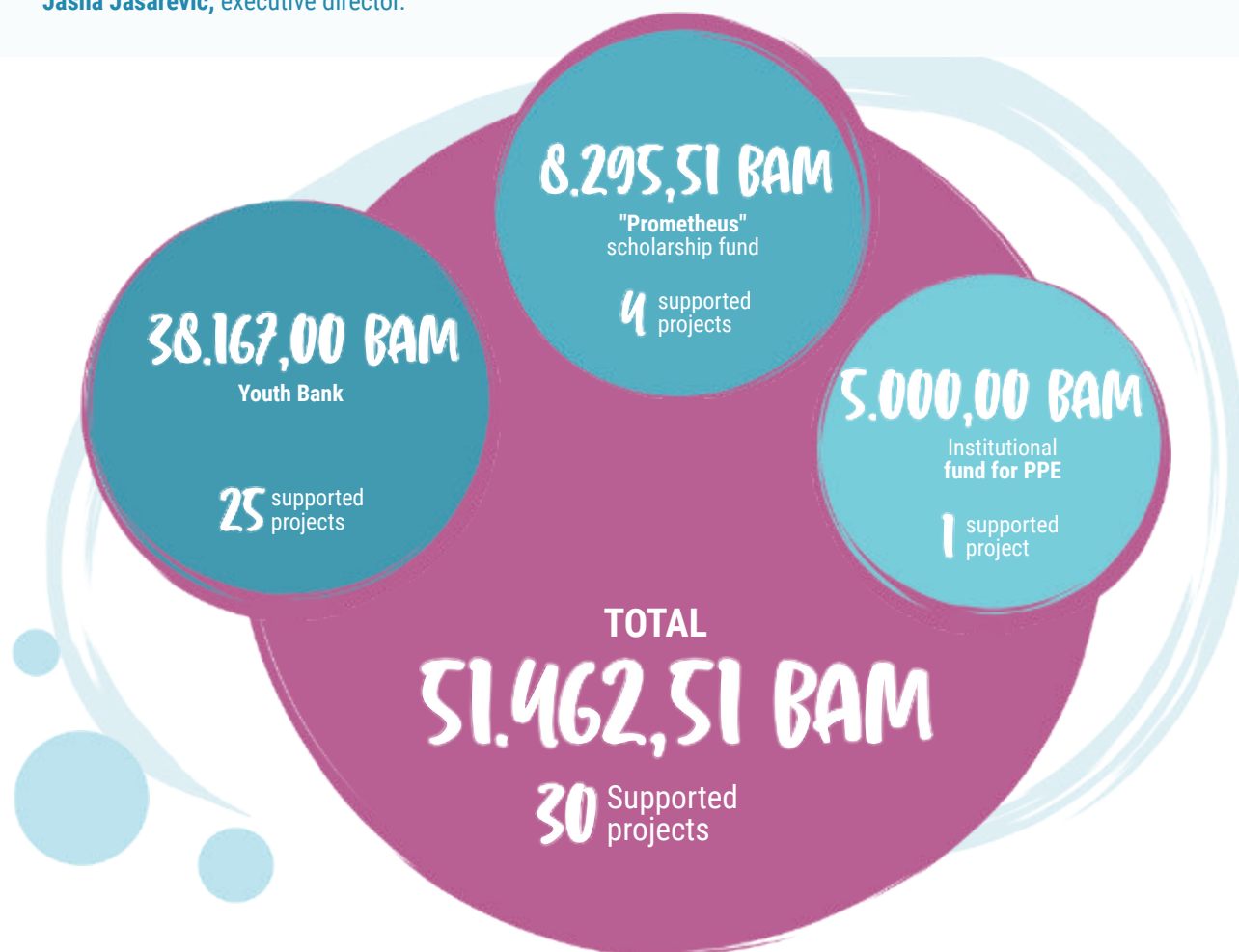
Cooperation with the Ministry of Sports, Culture and Youth of Tuzla Canton

In the premises of the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Youth of the Tuzla Canton, minister Zlatan Muratović and the executive director of the Tuzla Community Foundation, Jasna Jašarević, signed a memorandum of understanding on partnership and strategic cooperation between these two institutions with the goal of conducting joint activities aimed at improving the position of young people in the Tuzla Canton.

Financial support for young people and youth organizations

OPEN EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Foundation's Open Education program is based on the principles of the open education model, according to which all people should have access to educational opportunities. The outcomes of education adapted to the needs of those who learn, organized in easily accessible places and with the use of local resources, help participants to become aware and use their skills to improve their personal position, but also to shape the society in which they live. Thus, we continued to organize education in accordance with these principles, but also provided support to centres for open education.

Education of civil sector leaders

Training "Project management - development of a project proposal" (June 2021)



"Project management is extremely important for the work of civil society organizations, but also for the work of entities from other sectors. That is why we are organizing this training in order to strengthen the capacities of representatives of civil society organizations, local self-governments and the academic community, improve cooperation and encourage their participation in community life. This is precisely why we will continue with this and similar educations in the future."

Training "Advocacy, lobbying and management of fundraising campaigns" (October 2021)



During the training, the participants made four advocacy campaign plans, one of them being "Defrost your heart, warm the classroom" campaign, which was designed and planned by members of the Husino Local Development Group during the training with the aim of renovating the premises of the Husino elementary school with an emphasis on the building's energy efficiency.

Training "Community Organizing"- (December 2021)



"Since 99% of people involved in the work of local communities are men, I came here to learn how to increase the participation of women in the work of the local community. A woman's voice should be heard far and wide, because we really have something to say. I will pass on the knowledge I acquire here to the women in my group and encourage them to actively participate in the development of the community and the improvement of living conditions in Višća."

Workshops for strengthening the capacity of organizations "Philanthropy, fundraising, crowdfunding" (September 2021)

Assistance to association representatives in creating campaigns to raise funds to help the marginalized groups they work with (women, young people, the elderly) was given to six organizations (CA "Vive žene", CA "Žena ženi Kladanj", Association of Roma Women "Bolja budućnost", Association of Youth Baum Banovići, Association Youth Theater Tuzla and Network of Active Aging TC). The result of the workshops was a plan for 5 crowdfunding campaigns.



The three best ideas received initial support from the TCF, and by the end of the year, crowdfunding campaigns were launched for them on the online platform www.doniraj.ba.

Training "Sustainable development in everyday life" - (December 2021)

intended for representatives of the Kiseljak Local Development Group, with the aim of improving environmental awareness and learning about correct ecological choices in everyday life, in order to have a more effective environmental impact in the community. The training was designed and implemented in cooperation with the CA Center for Ecology and Energy.

Education in the field of entrepreneurship

Entrepreneurship education Tuzla Canton - As part of the training, 33 participants had the opportunity through 8 one-day workshops to learn more about entrepreneurship and business idea, product and market, business planning, marketing, and finally develop and create their own business plan. The goal of the education was to prepare the participants to start their own businesses through the development of their business plan. In accordance with the needs of the community and the type of entrepreneurial idea, the education was realized for two user groups:

- candidates who want to start or improve their established start-up business
- candidates who want to improve their household income activity (agriculture and livestock breeding)

During the two-month training, the candidates were provided with professional mentor support, which ultimately resulted in 10 candidates creating their own business plan and submitting requests for support in establishing or developing a company. On the other hand, 6 candidates submitted a request for support in the development of their income activity.

Education participants who had the intention of improving or starting their agricultural holding had the opportunity to attend vocational training related to the field they are engaged in (agriculture, livestock farming, poultry, greenhouse production, etc.)



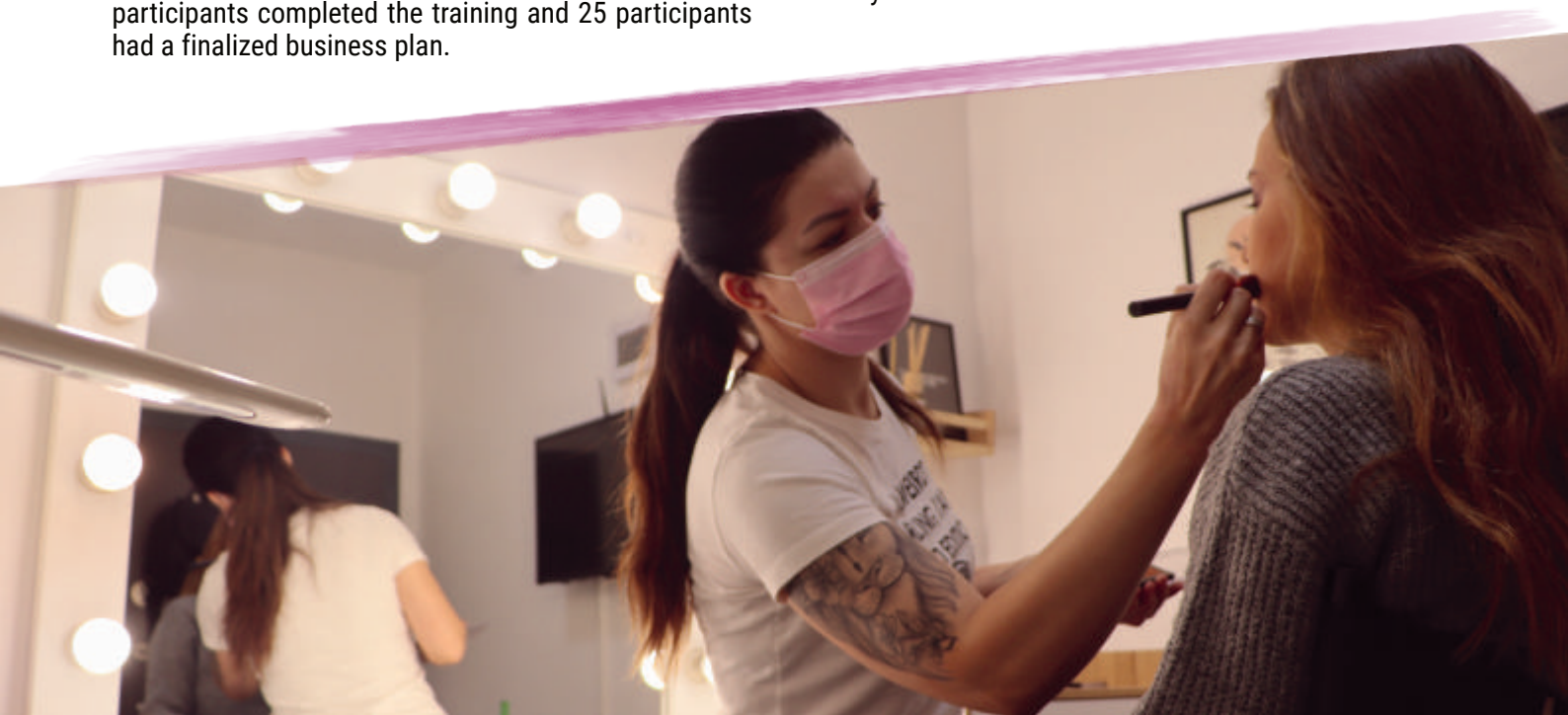
Education in entrepreneurship Local Community Kiseljak for 36 participants.

A special training program on the basics of entrepreneurship, business planning and business plan development was implemented with the aim of strengthening the entrepreneurial skills of citizens from the area of the Kiseljak municipality and creating preconditions for starting their own business or household income activity. In addition, professional workshops were held on the topic of fruit and vegetable production in greenhouses, poultry farming, pig farming, sheep farming and cattle breeding. All participants also received the support of a mentor in creating a business and financial plan for their income activity/business. In total, 36 participants completed the training and 25 participants had a finalized business plan.

Education for strengthening competencies for employability "You don't wait for a job; you look for a job!"

In cooperation with Agora Centre, at the end of the year we started an education program aimed at strengthening the competencies of the unemployed in order to be more competitive on the labor market and to find a job more easily.

During the year, nine participants passed the first module of education on the topic "Communication" and considering that the program foresees 5 modules that also include individual work with a counsellor, the education will be continued in the first months of the next year.



Community centers as community generators

Community Center Kiseljak

The Foundation continued to coordinate the work of the Social Center in the Kiseljak Municipality (City of Tuzla) with the aim of developing educational, inclusive, social, economic, cultural and other conditions for the benefit of all citizens in this community. During the year, the Center was available and used by civil society organizations (11), public institutions (3), informal groups of citizens (3), and even political parties (2), which carried out various activities. The Kiseljak Community Center has become the central place of the community, where numerous activities and contents are held for all categories of society.

Something for everyone

In the Kiseljak Community Center, numerous educations are organized on topics that correspond to the needs of the community:

- workshops for women in the field of social protection,
- workshops on the negative effects of underage marriages,
- workshops on addiction prevention for young people,
- informative sessions on healthy lifestyles,
- ecological workshops,
- skill building workshops,
- creative workshops for children,
- literary events for children.

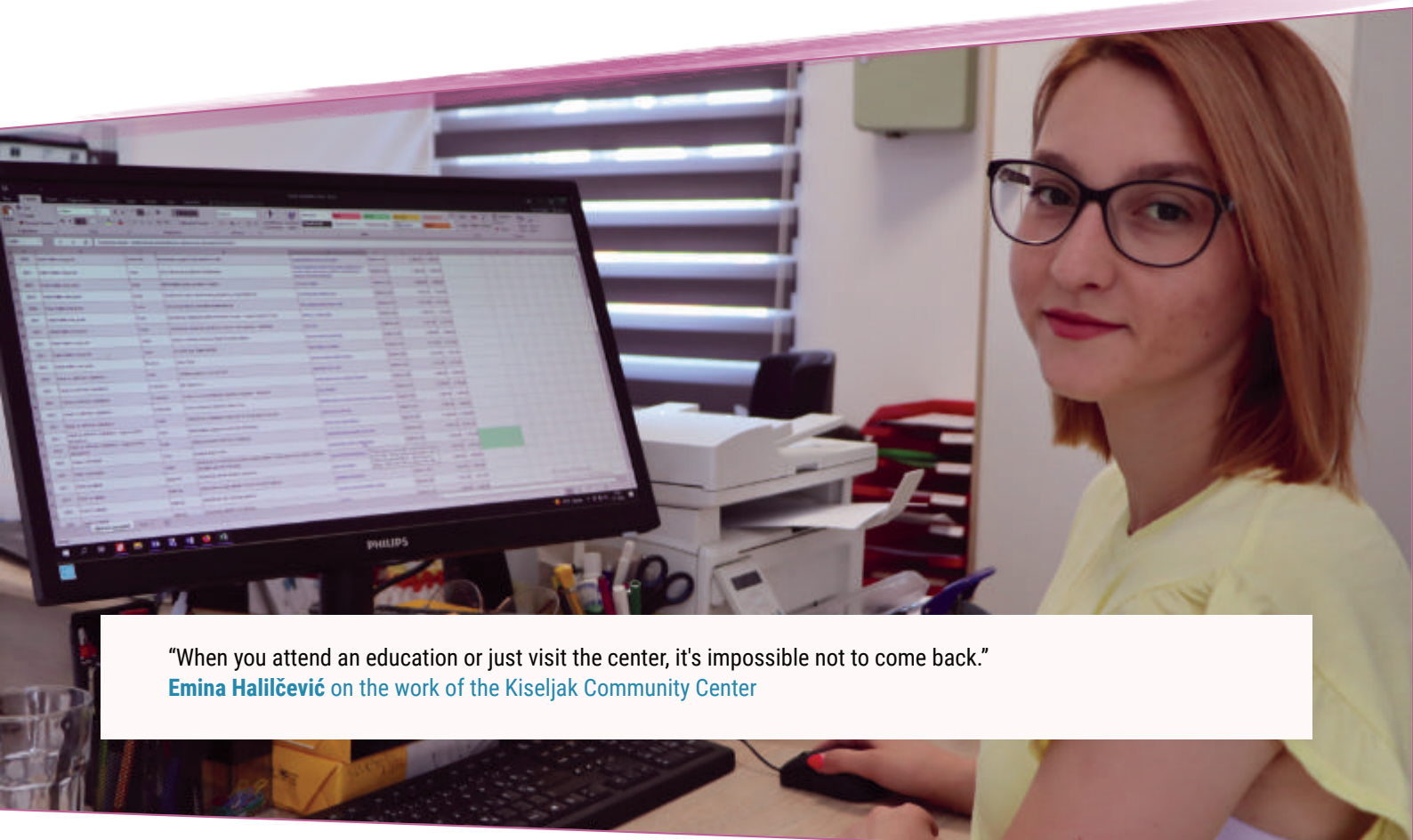

Community Center Agora Simin Han.

Due to unresolved proprietary issues and legal relations on the building of the center, this year the building was occasionally used exclusively as an information center for the citizens of Simin Han, and for the work and meetings of the Local Group for the Development of Simin Han, while organisation Agora, which resided and managed the center, from March 2020 moved their office to new premises in the city center. In cooperation with Agora and the Local Development Group, the Foundation was actively involved in negotiations with the city authorities to buy the building from the owner, and to keep it available to the citizens. Unfortunately, the negotiations are not finished, so the advocacy will continue next year.

Supporting the work of Citizens' Association Agora on the implementation of educational activities in the community

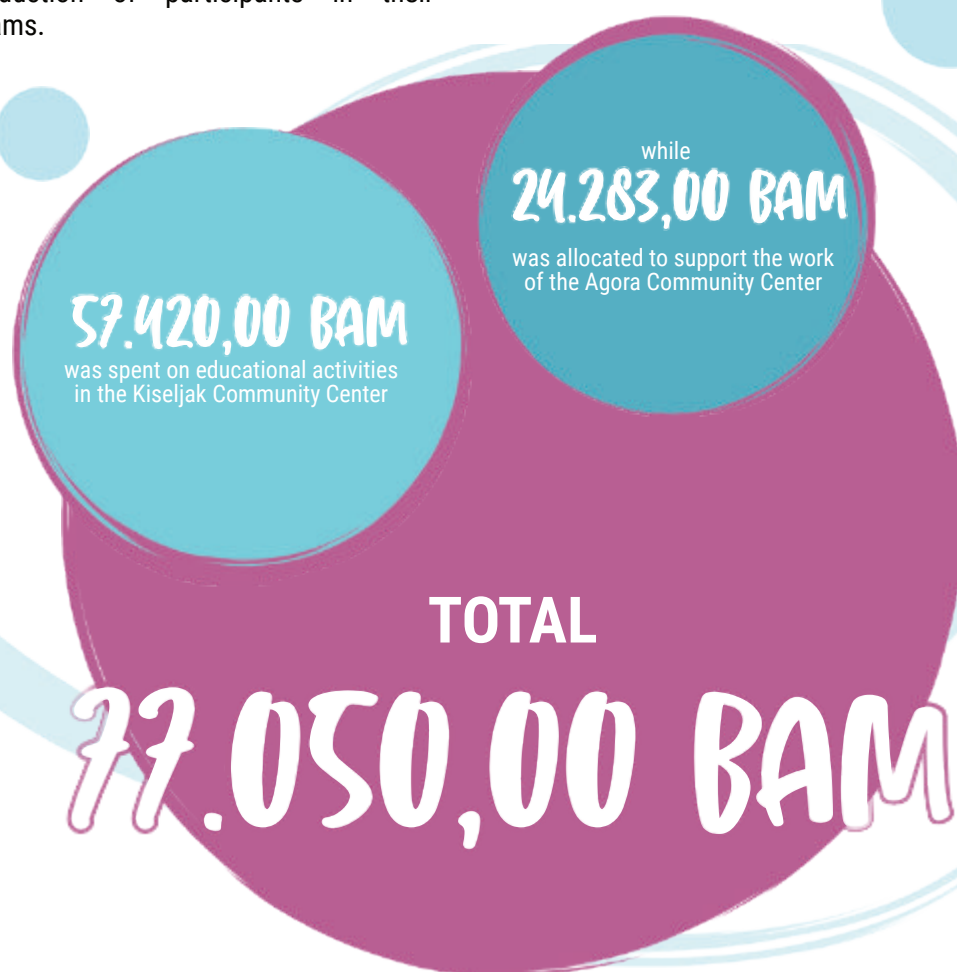
In 2021, TCF continued its advisory and financial support to the work and development of the Citizens' Association Agora, which during the year faced the challenges of organizing work in the conditions of the pandemic, which affected the reduction of participants in their educational programs.

IN FOCUS:

Strengthening cooperation with trade unions (education, health and trade) and education of unemployed and employed persons who are current or potential members of trade unions. An informatics course was organized, psychosocial support workshops, meetings, study exchanges and forums were held, and 35 people took part in the training.

PROGRAMS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY:

In cooperation with TCF, CA Agora joined the process of preparing educational programs in the Kiseljak Community Center. An inquiry of the needs of local citizens for informal education was carried out, and a training program plan was created in accordance with the needs of the citizens for the next three years. 7 informal trainings were defined, and this year the curricula for 4 informal education programs were created, the realization of which will start in the next year.

**Financial support within the Open Education Program**

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

With the aim of strengthening cooperation between the civil, public and business sectors, as well as strengthening the capacity of local leaders and organizations, and improving the living conditions of marginalized groups, especially in the neglected marginal communities of the Tuzla Canton, the Foundation continued to provide financial, organizational and advisory support to active citizens and to civil society organizations in the implementation of specific initiatives that contribute to the development of the community. Cooperation with the strategic partner "Network of Active Communities" (MAZ) also continued, which continued to expand the Organization Model to new communities in TC. In addition, this year we have additionally organized activities in which we tried to mitigate the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic for the most sensitive categories of society (young people, women and the elderly). In order to better respond to these challenges, we have initiated new collaborations with authorities, institutions and organizations on the implementation of campaigns to help the mentioned population groups.

Community organizing in cooperation with the Network of Active Communities

Democracy in action - everyone's participation in community development

The Community Organizing Model that has been applied since the Foundation was established is fully adapted to the needs of our communities, traditions, culture and customs of our residents. This innovative model of organizing citizens in micro-environments (local communities and settlements) is implemented by the Network of Active Communities with the aim of empowering and strengthening the capacity of citizens to become successful community organizers and bearers of positive changes in their society. This year, 15 communities expressed interest in the Community Organizing Model, and 10 new communities joined the MAZ after education and familiarization with the model, where the focus and special attention was placed on the cooperation of Local Development Groups with local communities and the inclusion of representatives of marginalized group.

The activities of this program were implemented with the support of the German Ministry for Economic Development and Cooperation (BMZ) through the project "Democratic and economic empowerment of underdeveloped communities of TK" (2018-2022) and the project "Inclusive development of the Kiseljak community, for the improvement of the social and economic aspects of citizens' lives, especially the Roma", and with the support of the Porticus Foundation from Austria and USAID BiH in the realization of the project "Our community is our responsibility" (2020-2024), which is implemented within the framework of USAID's Local Strength program and Porticus' Civil Sector Strengthening Program in BiH. Support for organizations that work with vulnerable categories of society was implemented with the support of the Balkan Trust for Democracy, through the German Marshall Fund of the United States and USAID through the project "Fight against the COVID-19 pandemic through philanthropy and solidarity" (2021-2022).



"The main role in the communities is still played by men, but what is good is that almost every community has women's representatives in local groups, and half of them also have youth representatives. NETWORK OF ACTIVE COMMUNITIES - AN ORGANIZATION OF TRUST

The Tuzla Community Foundation and the Network of Active Communities have established a long-term partnership until 2024 as part of USAID's Local Power program. As part of this program, MAZ is included in the organizational capacity assessment program conducted by the Institute for Youth Development Kult, which aims to strengthen the organization's capacity. The Network was evaluated as a trustworthy organization, and the segment that was evaluated as extremely positive was the relationship with the membership.

Conference "Functional councils of local communities, the key to development at the local level".

Network of Active Communities (MAZ), with the support of the Tuzla Community Foundation, organized the 14th conference of active citizens in September 2021 at the Tuzla National Theatre. The focus of this year's conference was a panel discussion on the functionality and role of local community councils.

Given that local communities, by their function, should be places for direct involvement of citizens in community life and initiators of changes at the micro-local level, their expediency, operation and legal-organizational structure are often questioned.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THE PANEL:

- depoliticize local communities,
- enable the direct election of citizens to councils of local communities,
- ensure legal subjectivity to local communities,
- educate existing and future council members,
- modernize and reorganize municipal services in charge of working with local communities.

This topic is of particular importance for local communities from the area of the City of Tuzla, where the Statute of the City of Tuzla was adopted in May, which states that the City Council should make a decision on regulating the electoral process in local communities, and that the councils of local communities are obliged to adopt statutes of local community and perform all organizing tasks.



"We all agreed that it is necessary to ensure the possibility of direct election of citizens to the councils of local communities, but also to establish a better organizational system of work and flow of information between the local community and the competent service."

Development of the Kiseljak local community

The Tuzla Community Foundation has entered its sixth year of implementation of a special initiative for the development of the Kiseljak settlement in Tuzla with an emphasis on Roma integration. Activities in Kiseljak imply a coherent approach, cooperation and involvement of numerous institutions in interventions and working bodies whose work is connected and coordinated. In addition to animating citizens to take organized action in the development of the community, the activities also have an educational and economic component, which will be presented separately in separate chapters of the report.

"The development of the local community Kiseljak Foundation is based on a comprehensive approach and interventions in the areas of environmental protection, improvement of education, social protection and employment, and implements them in cooperation with the Local Development Group Kiseljak and numerous partner organizations and institutions with the financial support of the Freudenberg Foundation and the German Ministry for Economic Development and Cooperation (BMZ). This approach is based on the implementation of the Strategic Plan for the development of the Local Community Kiseljak."

Local Development Group Kiseljak and local initiatives -

An important role in the development of the community is played by the Local Development Group Kiseljak, which is a member of the Network of Active Communities. In 2021, representatives of the local group for the development of Kiseljak launched several initiatives, of which it is important to highlight the initiatives to protect the source of drinking water "Stubo Poljana" in the implementation of Women's Association of the Kiseljak Local Community, and the project of arranging the source of drinking water "Studenac" in the implementation of an informal group of citizens "Studenac".

Introduction of primary waste selection in households.

As part of the support for creating conditions for the sustainable development of the Local community Kiseljak this year we implemented the activity that focused on introduction of primary waste selection in households in the area of Kiseljak. The activity was done in cooperation with Public Communal Company Komunalac, responsible for removal and management waste, and UG Center for Ecology and Energy due to expertise.

Each household received a 240-liter bin for packaging waste and a 120-liter bin for mixed garbage, as well as instructions on proper separation of waste.

For this purpose, information sessions were held in through which citizens are introduced to the primary selection waste, and then the distribution of bins for sorting out packaging and mixed garbage was carried out for 412 households.

In addition, activities were carried out with the aim of improving the management of bulky waste disposed by collectors of secondary raw materials, which was identified years ago as one of the main reasons for creating illegal landfills. Additional cooperation was established with PUC "Komunalac", so that collectors now dispose of such waste at a common "collection" place, which is later taken to the city landfill in an organized manner.

Projects for the improvement of social life in Kiseljak

- "Kiseljak Table Tennis Cup" with the aim of promoting sports and healthy lifestyles in the realization of CA "Zemlja djece" in Bosnia and Herzegovina;
- "When marriage ends childhood" through which young people are educated about the risks of underage marriage in the implementation of CA "Početak";
- The theater department realized by the Roma youth club in the Kiseljak Community Center.

Solidarity in the fight against the consequences of the pandemic

The Tuzla community foundation launched the project "Fight against the COVID-19 pandemic through philanthropy and solidarity" in order to face the consequences that the pandemic left on the most sensitive categories of the population, such as young people, women and people of the third age.



„The pandemic brought additional burdens for activists in the communities, as they continued their volunteer engagement without any additional support. During the psychoeducational sessions, they became aware of the need for additional self-care, which until now, despite fatigue and psychosomatic complaints, they had not practiced.”

“It is a big challenge for me to balance activism and self-care, because we are surrounded by endless problems. The impulse to push myself beyond my limits is hard to resist, because activists are usually driven by a vision of a better society. Although most people today speak wisely about the importance of self-care, I believe that it is still very superficial and that the enormous stress and burn-out we are experiencing due to the pandemic is a real opportunity to more radically rethink the way we act as activists. The goal is not to work 500% for two years, but to find a balance and be activists throughout life.”

The project is aimed at establishing cooperation and providing support to civil society organizations that work with the above-mentioned target groups, in order to strengthen the organizations and thus more easily deal with the consequences of crisis situations in the future.

Within the framework of this project, more than 80 representatives of organizations at the forums shared their personal and professional experiences about the

various situations they lived through during the pandemic, and in cooperation with professional associations and experts in this field, the Foundation provided forum participants who expressed a need (mainly young people and women), psychological support in the form of group and individual therapies.

Supporting the Active Aging Network.

The pandemic has significantly jeopardised the health and living conditions of the elderly. In order to raise citizens' awareness of the importance of supporting elderly people in their efforts to remain active, cooperation was established with the Network of Active Aging and the Institute of Public Health of the Republic of Turkey, as well as with organizations and institutions that treat the problems of elderly people: Center for

social work TC, Red Cross TC, Red Cross Tuzla, PI Retirement Home Tuzla.

In order to enable a coordinated approach to solving this problem, the Foundation arranged meetings with representatives of the authorities (Ministry of Health of TC) where they discussed the possibilities of establishing Centers for Healthy Aging in Tuzla, i.e., in TC. In order to exchange best practices, a study visit to the Centers for Healthy Aging in Sarajevo and East Ilidža was organized, where the participants had the opportunity to exchange knowledge and experiences related to the establishment of the centers, their work and functioning, as well as financing.

In addition, the Foundation supported the work of the Active Aging Network, i.e., their Initial Group for Active Aging in 5 local communities in TC, in order to ensure

better conditions in the premises used by the elderly for their activities.

Special ad-hoc initiatives for better living conditions

For my happier childhood" campaign"

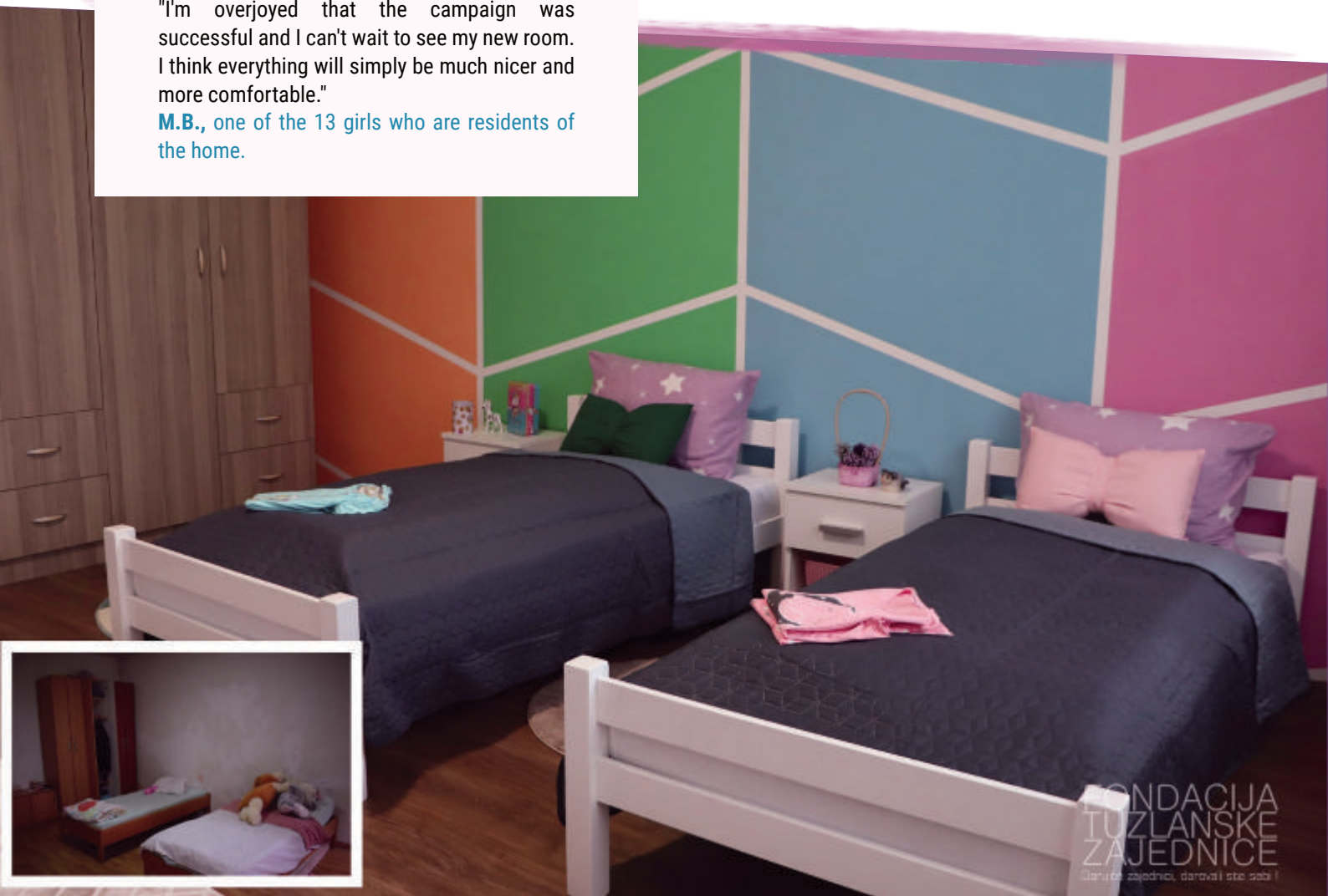

Menprom Tuzla, and the management of the PI Home for Children without Parental Care Tuzla have launched a fund-raising campaign called "For my happier childhood", which will be used for the renovation of the premises where 13 residents of the Home for Children without Parental Care in Tuzla reside. The premises occupy an area of 257 m2 and consist of a spacious living room with a dining room, 6 bedrooms with attached

toilets and 2 balconies. All the mentioned premises were in very bad condition and did not provide good conditions for children to stay and grow up.

In the period from February to May, 55,419 BAM was collected thanks to the efforts of 224 donors. Immediately after the campaign, a comprehensive renovation of the facility began, and in October, 13 residents of the Home moved into the new premises.

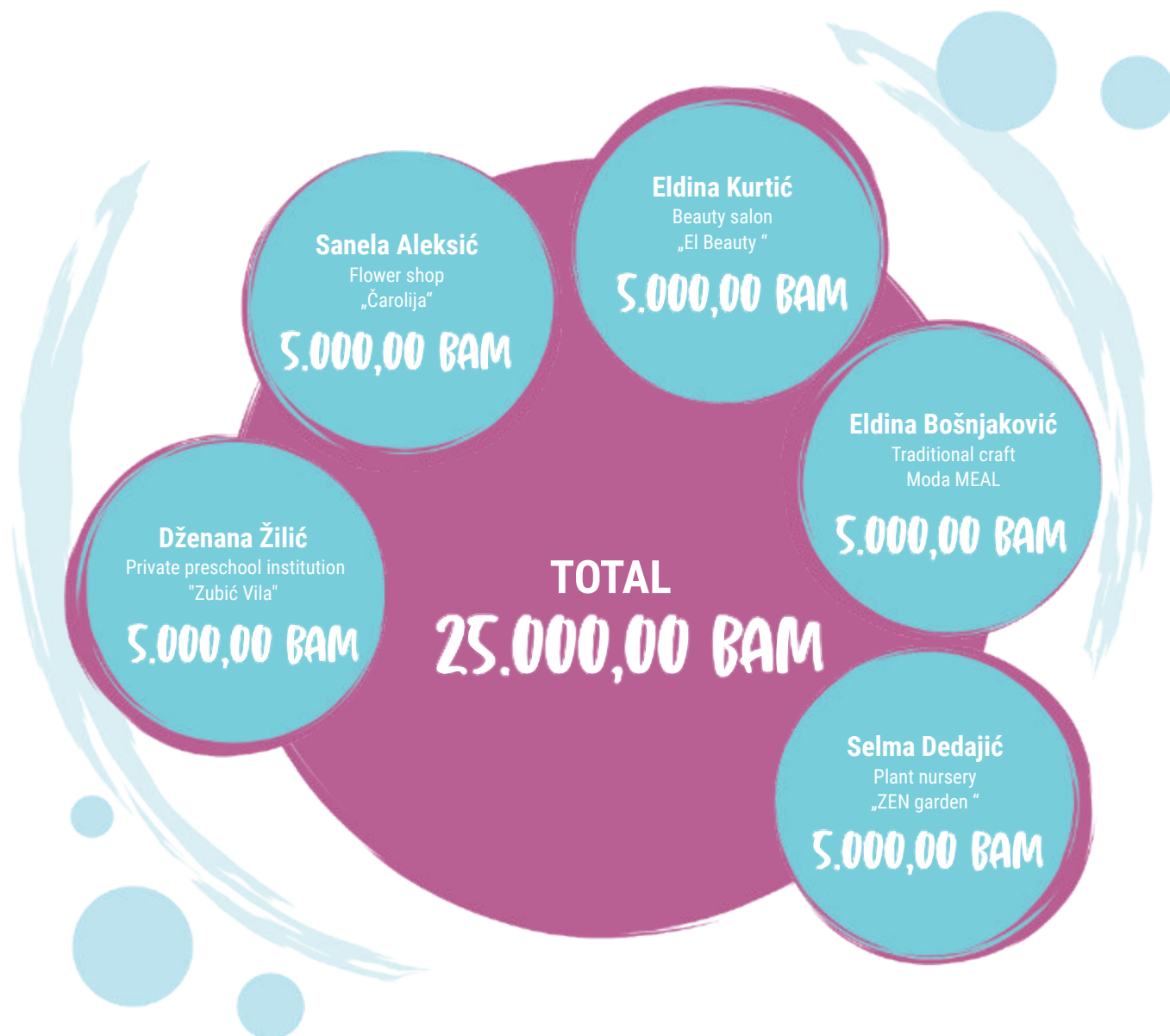

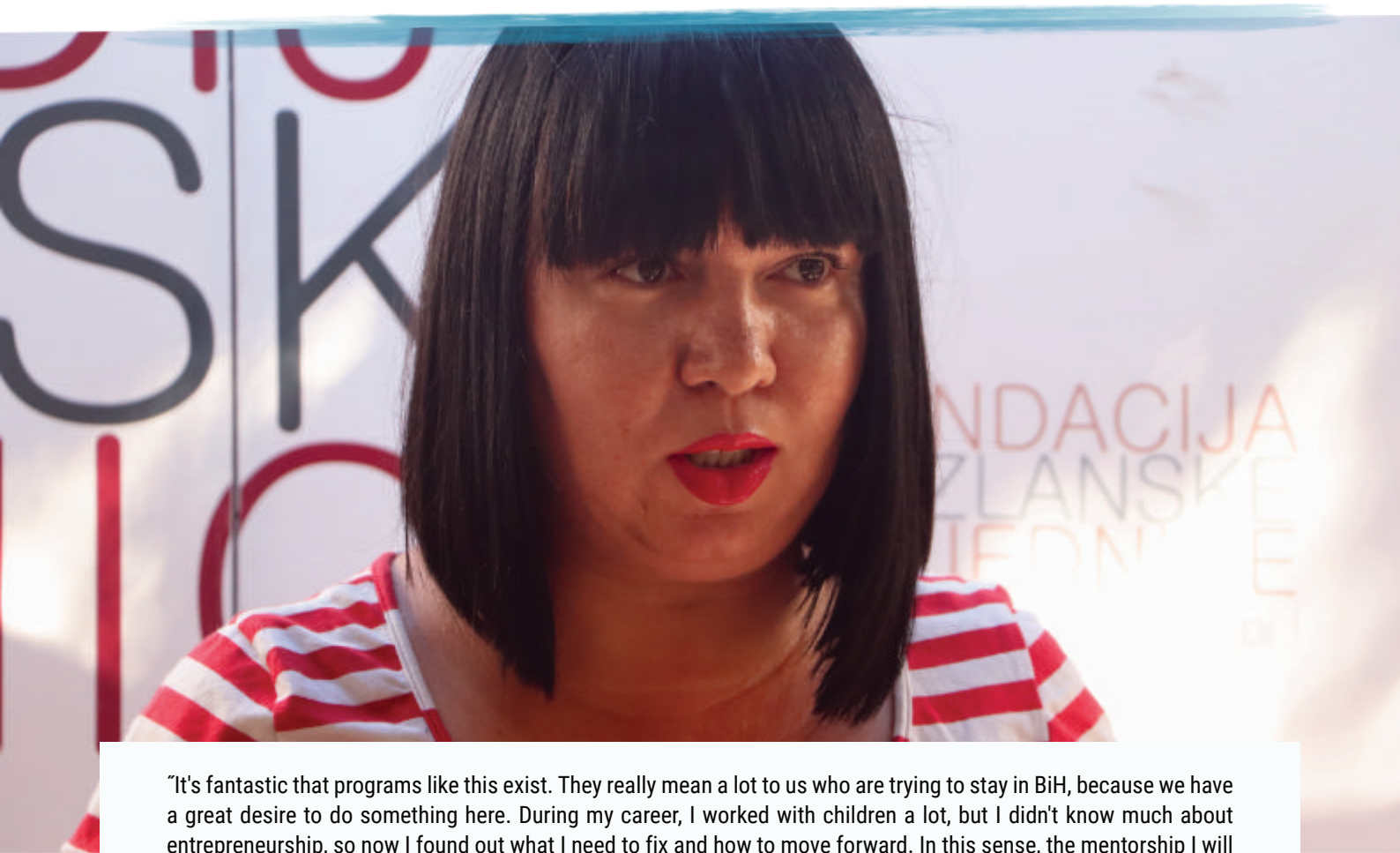
ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM

In order to contribute to the creation of a better entrepreneurial environment and opportunities for self-employment, we continued with the activities of supporting small entrepreneurs in the Tuzla Canton, but also with the activities of creating opportunities for employment and self-employment in the Tuzla community of Kiseljak, a community of worse socio-economic status with the largest percentage of Roma population in BiH.

Support for the development of entrepreneurial initiatives in TC

After the successfully implemented education program, the Tuzla Community Foundation supported the development of five small businesses and 6 income-generating activities of households. In addition to financial support, entrepreneurs were also provided with mentoring support and support in the form of promotion of their business ideas.

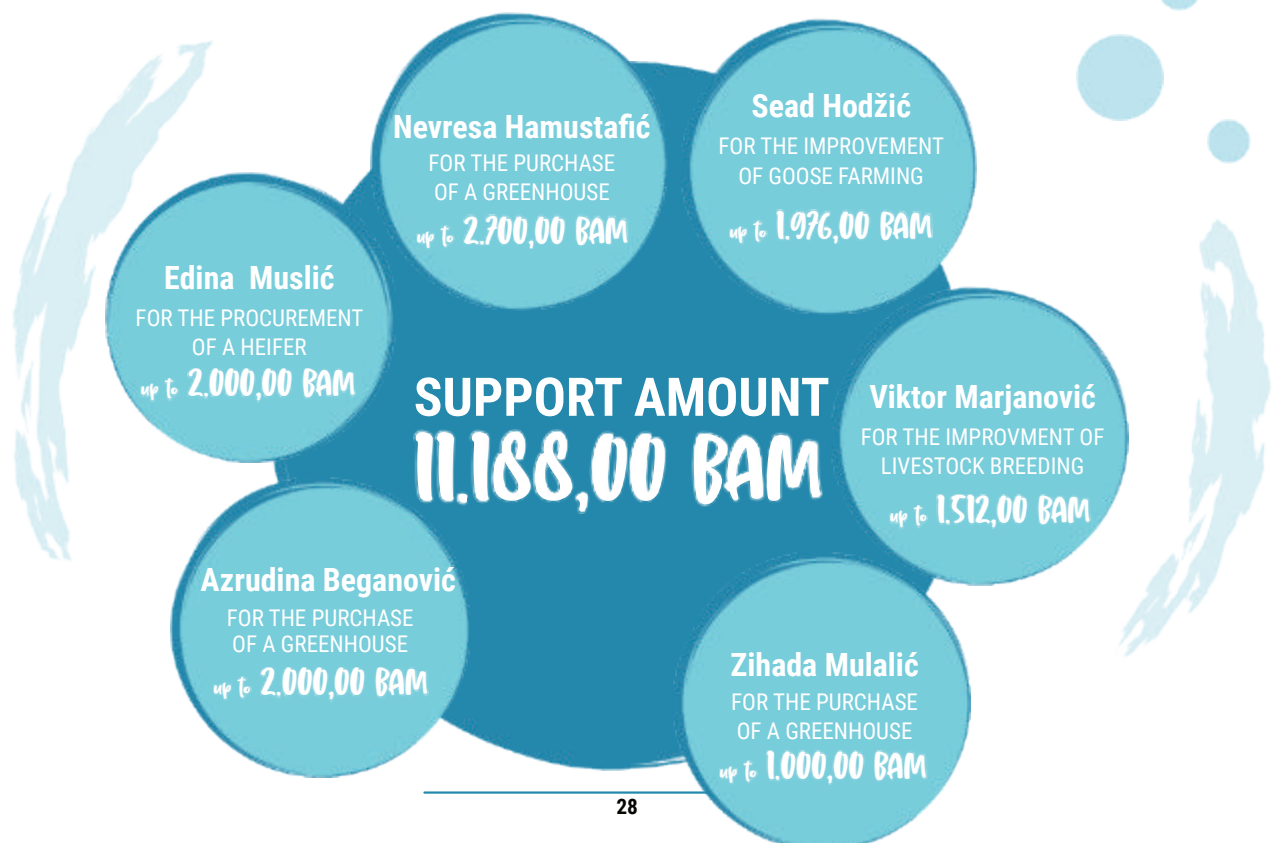

Support for the development of income activities of farmers and herders in TK.



Support for employment and development of entrepreneurial opportunities in LC Kiseljak, City of Tuzla.

After the education on entrepreneurship, which was attended by 36 people in Kiseljak, 26 candidates submitted requests for financial support for the development of their own household income activity or for starting a registered business. By inspecting the situation on the field and checking the possibilities for starting or developing their business, the Foundation approved support for 14 candidates in August, while 13 female candidates received support for the development of income activities.

Support for the development of crafts and small businesses in Kiseljak

After more than 35 years, a hair salon was opened for the first time in Kiseljak. "Dino's barbershop" has always been the dream of young Ajdin Beganović, which he turned into reality this year with the support of the Foundation. After training as a hairdresser, this young man gained experience in practice, and then through the support program for entrepreneurs, he got the opportunity to succeed in business himself.

"It has always been my dream to open my own salon. There was an education at the Foundation, so I signed up to learn how to make it happen. I also went to other workshops in order to gain knowledge on how to open a salon and run it. I wrote a business plan, I passed and they supported me."

Support to collectors of secondary raw materials in Kiseljak

Around thirty families of Roma nationality from the Kiseljak local community earn money for their children's living and education by collecting secondary raw materials. They collect waste, which they then sort, clean and offer to buyers for sale. They work hard, 16 hours a day in the season. Collecting secondary raw materials is mostly done by men of Roma nationality with no or insufficient level of education, for whom it is the main source of income.

In order to contribute to the increase of employability, environmental protection and development of the local community of Kiseljak, the Foundation organized free professional counseling and financial support for this category of population for the improvement of work and work safety during the separation of raw materials.

The great interest expressed by the locals in the Kiseljak LC for this support is evidence that they are aware of the fact that safety should be at a higher level, that the yards where they do the selection must be arranged, and that responsible handling and waste management are key in everything. At the same time, this type of support allows for the creation of better safety conditions for collectors, gives them the opportunity to earn, and at the same time contributes to the protection of the environment.

„I'm managing. We survive somehow. When it's high season, I work all day, I leave in the morning at 7, I return in the evening around 9-10. After that I have to unload the van. It's not easy. It's hard for me both mentally and physically, but just sitting does nothing.”

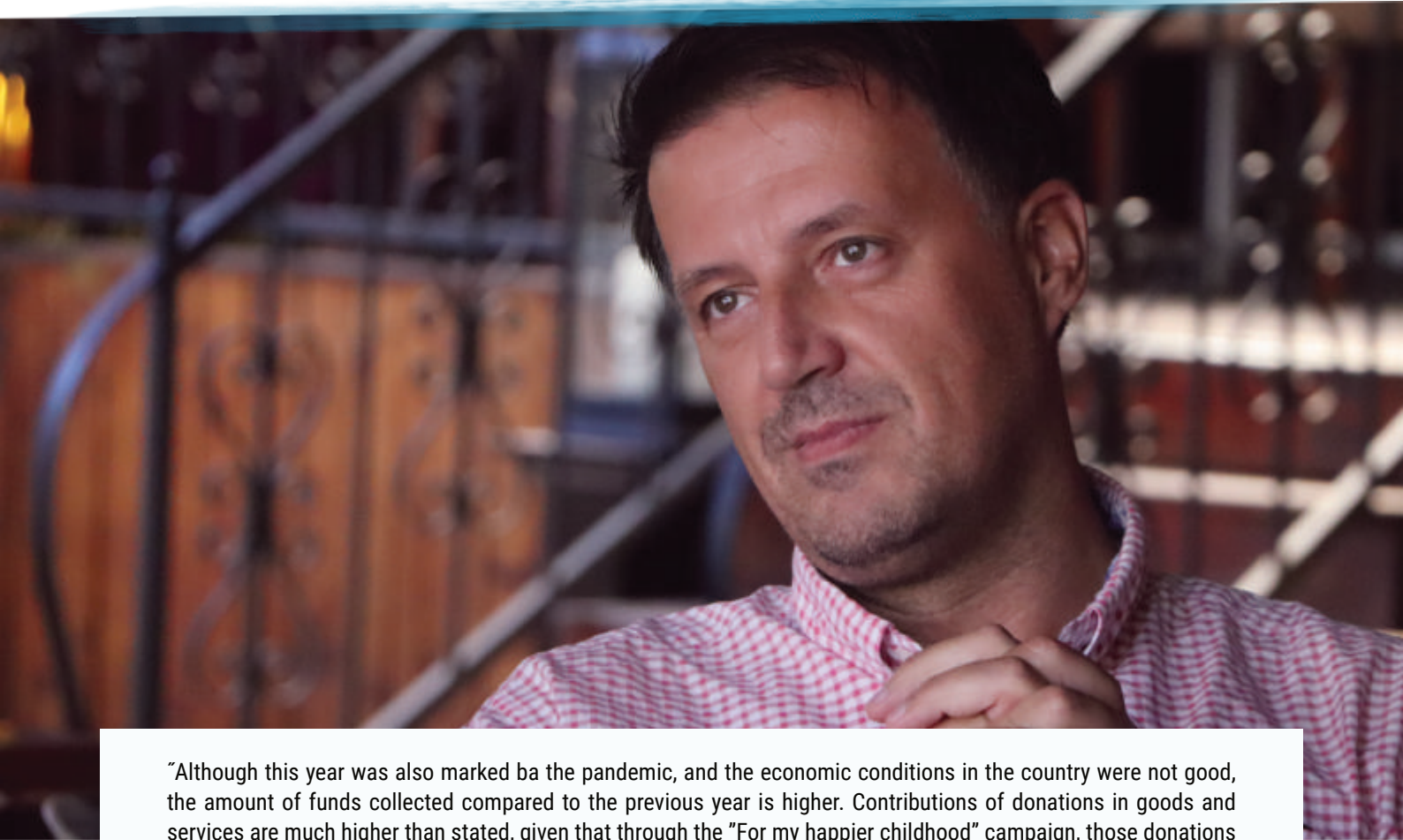
PHILANTHROPY PROGRAM

TCF has a unique mission to promote philanthropy and the inclusion of all in community development. In 2021, we worked on connecting individuals, companies, families and other donors to, under the same roof, jointly organize voluntary donations to support local communities and the civil sector in the Tuzla region. Through philanthropic funds, flow-through or debt, thematic, dedicated or scholarship funds, as well as memorial funds, we provide long-term support to initiatives and projects for the benefit of the community.

This year, in addition to cooperation with international donors, we also achieved significant cooperation with domestic donors, individuals in the country and the diaspora, and companies in Bosnia and Herzegovina. By combining the funds of domestic donors with the funds we secured from international donors, we increased the effects of investment in the community, but also respected the philanthropic wishes of individuals, as well as the socially responsible activities of companies. Raising and pooling of funds is done in a transparent way, using different tools, the most important of which is the unique platform for donating

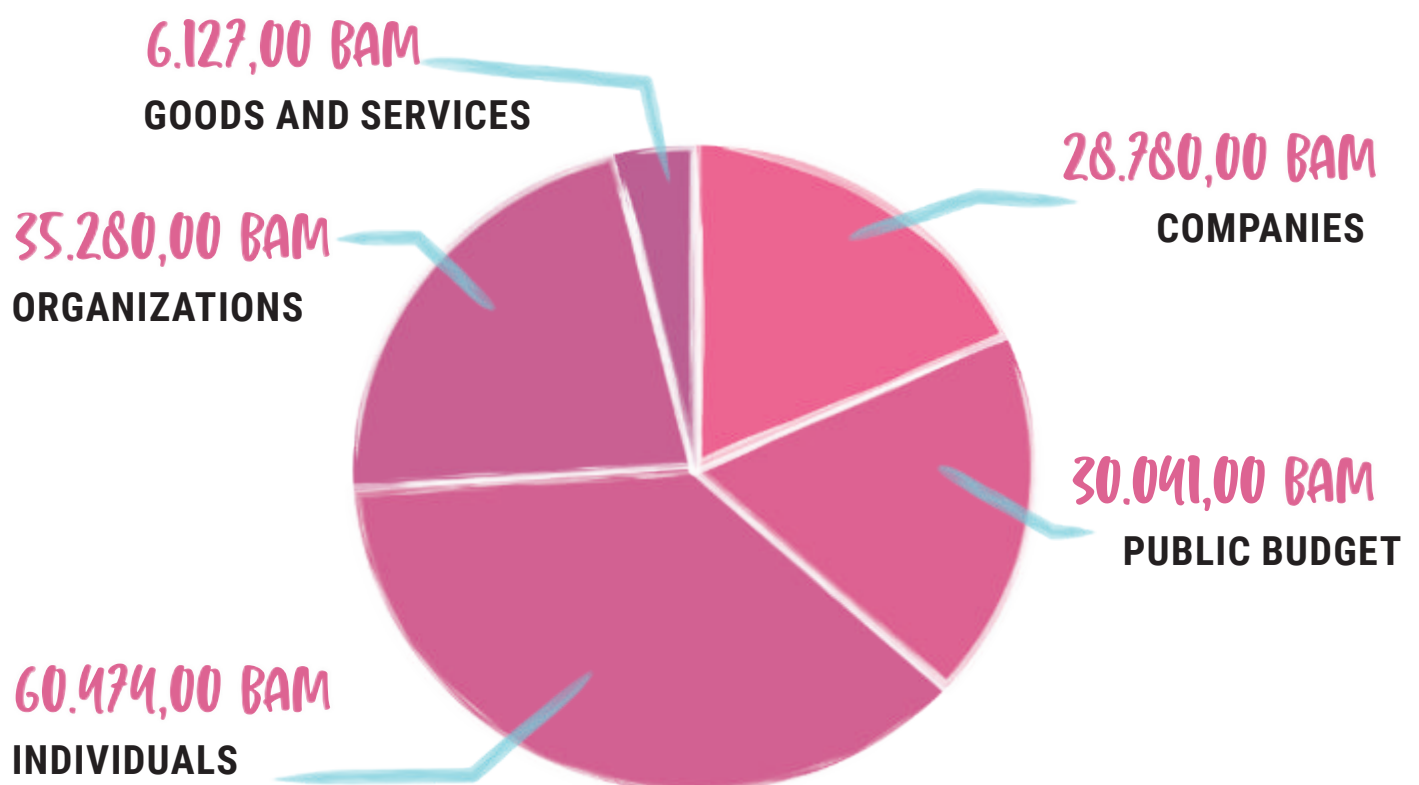

The campaign "For my happier childhood"

One of the most significant campaigns in the last year was aimed at collecting funds for the renovation of the premises in the Home for Children Without Parental Care Tuzla. On the initiative of Mrs. Merima Dževdetbegović and Menprom d.o.o., and thanks to the efforts of over 200 donors, more than 55,000 BAM were collected for the renovation of the premises and the creation of better living conditions for 13 girls, residents of the home. The

media, the Dautbašić and Ribić families, BH basketball players, handball players, the employees of the home, Edin Šerifović, , also made a great contribution to the implementation of the campaign and we thank them all from the bottom of our hearts. In October, this campaign was crowned with the ceremonial opening of the renovated and decorated premises.

Philanthropy in the BiH diaspora

In order to establish cooperation with the BiH diaspora, the Foundation established cooperation with the organization "I-diaspora" from Switzerland and the Pangea Network. In October 2021, the first online meeting with the Tuzla diaspora called "Tuzla Meet-up" was organized in order to connect with people who want to stay in touch with their homeland and contribute to its development, either through sharing professional knowledge or through co-financing local projects, but also by active involvement in events organized to promote local traditions, culture and knowledge.

Cooperation also continued with the organization in Germany "Zukunft Gestalten Bosnien", which was founded with the aim of collecting funds for projects implemented or supported by the Foundation.



III PROGRAM AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Grant commissions:

a total of 163 people (M 62, F 101) participated in the decision-making process on financial support for initiatives of citizens and civil society organizations, divided into 9 commissions (8 appointed and 1 advisory). The members of the commissions are citizens of different occupations, professions, ages and genders who voluntarily participate in making decisions and deciding on the allocation of funds. The commissions are empowered by the TCF Board of Directors for a term of two years, except for the commissions from the Youth Fund, which are empowered for one year. Committees at the Youth Fund, i.e., Boards of Youth Banks, are also the most numerous committees that, in addition to deciding on support for youth initiatives, voluntarily participate in a number of different activities and events of interest to young people. The decision-making process took place transparently, democratically according to pre-established criteria for each fund.

Study visits and networking

Considering the situation caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and the security measures that were taken around the world during this period and that limited the movement and gathering of a large number of people, a study visit was organized to exchange experiences and examples of good practice, which was held in Belgrade.

During the year, numerous online meetings with partners were organized where TCF was especially engaged in cooperation with partners on the USAID program "Local Power", then the Portikus Foundation program "Strengthening civil engagement in BiH", and network meetings through a partnership with the Olof Palme Center and the Secondary National School from Sweden. We took part and continued cooperation with the Mozaik Foundation and partners in the "Local Power" program in creating a legal framework for philanthropy.

Cooperation with international donors and authorities

In 2021, TCF maintained cooperation with long-standing donors, such as the Freudenberg Foundation and the International Olof Palme Center. In addition, the project of the inclusion of the Roma population in Kiseljak, which is co-financed by the Freudenberg Foundation and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Development and Cooperation, was approved.

The project "Our community is our responsibility", which the Foundation is implementing with the support of USAID BiH in August 2020, entered its second year of implementation in the difficult circumstances of the pandemic. The same project is additionally supported by the Portikus Foundation from Austria and is successfully implemented by the project and management team.

During 2021, cooperation was also established with a new donor, which previously financed TCF, the Balkan Trust for Democracy, with whose help the Foundation provided financial and other support to organizations whose primary target groups are youth, women and persons of the third age. Also in December, we received approval for a project to promote entrepreneurship among youth organizations called "Young social entrepreneurs as agents of change", which was co-financed by the European Union through the program called "By Leap" (Balkan youth: Linking Education, Abilities and Partnership Potential in Regional Employment Practice). The project will be implemented in 2022.

Regarding cooperation with the authorities, cooperation with the City of Tuzla, the City of Srebrenik, the City of Živinice and the Municipality of Lukavac continued. Cooperation with the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Turkey continued, which approved the co-financing of the project supported by an international donor "Solidarity and philanthropy in the fight against the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic". Within the implementation of this project, we established direct cooperation with the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Turkey and the Institute of Public Health of the Republic of Turkey, while with an informal network of civil society organizations, we initiated a meeting with the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Turkey to discuss the possibility of establishing a Coordinating Body for cooperation between governmental and non-governmental sector, which is one of the measures planned in the Development Strategy for TC 2021-2027.

EXTERNAL AUDIT REPORT

To the Management of the Tuzla Community Foundation

We have audited finance reports of the Tuzla Community Foundation (hereinafter referred to as: the Foundation), comprising Balance Sheet dated 31.12.2021, Income statement for the period from 01.01 to 31.12.2021, and notes to finance reports, including the summarized important accounting policies and annual activity report of the foundation.

Opinion

In our opinion, the finance reports present objectively and realistically, in all material lines, the financial status of the Foundation on 31st December 2021, and its business results pursuant to the legislative framework of finance reporting.

Basis for our opinion

We have conducted the audit pursuant to the International Audit Standards (IAS). Our obligations based on those standards are described in details in the chapter of our report titled Responsibilities of the Auditor for the Audit of Finance Reports. We are independent from the organisation pursuant to the ethical requirements relevant for our financial audit and we meet other ethical obligations pursuant to those requirements (IESBA Code). We believe that the audit proofs we provided are sufficient and adequate to ensure the reasonable basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibility of Management for Finance Report

Management is responsible for preparing the finance reports, as well as for those internal controls the management deems necessary to prepare Finance Reports without major discrepancies in presentation due to fraud or error.
